

POM Vaccine Update

April 21, 2021

Update from POM. **COVID vaccination appointments are available to all eligible DoD beneficiaries over 18**, ergo NPS Staff, Faculty, Students, and Tricare eligible dependents.

The schedule:

- **Thursday, 22 APR**
 - **1st dose appointments (~200 doses available)**
- **Friday, 23 APR**
 - **1st dose appointments (~150 doses available)**
 - **2nd dose appointments (~150 doses available)**
- **Monday, 26 APR**
 - **1st dose appointments (~150 doses available)**
 - **2nd dose appointments (~100 doses available)**
- **Tuesday, 27 APR**
 - **2nd dose appointments (~150)**

- **Also, please update the NPS Vaccine Tracking if you can, thank you again.** While this is voluntary, it assists NPS in reopening decisions.

Notes:

- POM can ONLY provide 2nd doses to individuals that received their 1st dose from CALMED.
- **2nd dose information**
 - You should schedule your 2nd dose 28 days after your 1st dose.
 - The specific date for your 2nd dose is written on the back of your CDC COVID vaccination card.
 - You may get the 2nd vaccination as early as 24 days after your 1st dose or as late as 42 days after your 1st dose.
 - However, please make an effort to schedule your 2nd dose appointment on or as close to 28 days after your 1st dose as possible. If there are no appointments available on a specific date, you can schedule your appointment on the next available date.
 - The appointment portal will require you to enter the date of your 1st dose and will advise when you are in the window.
- **COVID vaccination appointments are available to all eligible DoD beneficiaries over 18** at the Weckerling Center on POM. DoD beneficiaries under Chapter 55 of Title 10 USC and in accordance with reference DoD COVID-19 Vaccination Program
 - Government Civilian Employees that work for us (DACs, NAFs)
 - Military
 - Military retirees
 - Tricare beneficiaries

Restrictions on receiving vaccine:

1. Cannot receive vaccine if you are leaving the area with no expectation of returning more than 30 days after you receive your first shot

2. You must wait at least 14 days after getting the COVID-19 vaccine before getting any other vaccine, including a flu or shingles vaccine.
