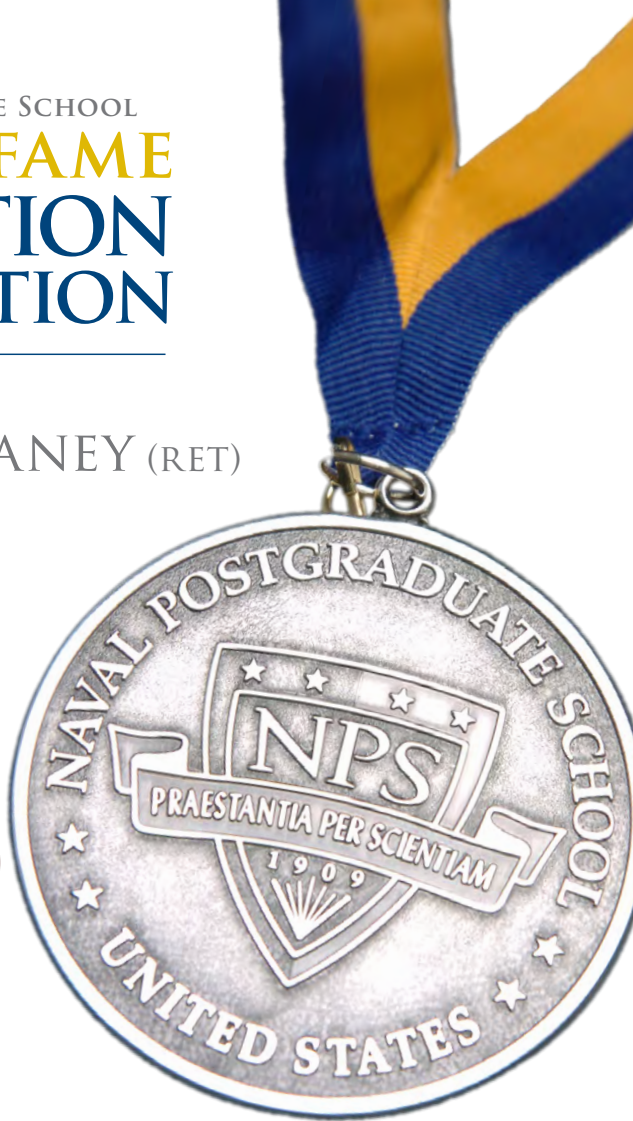

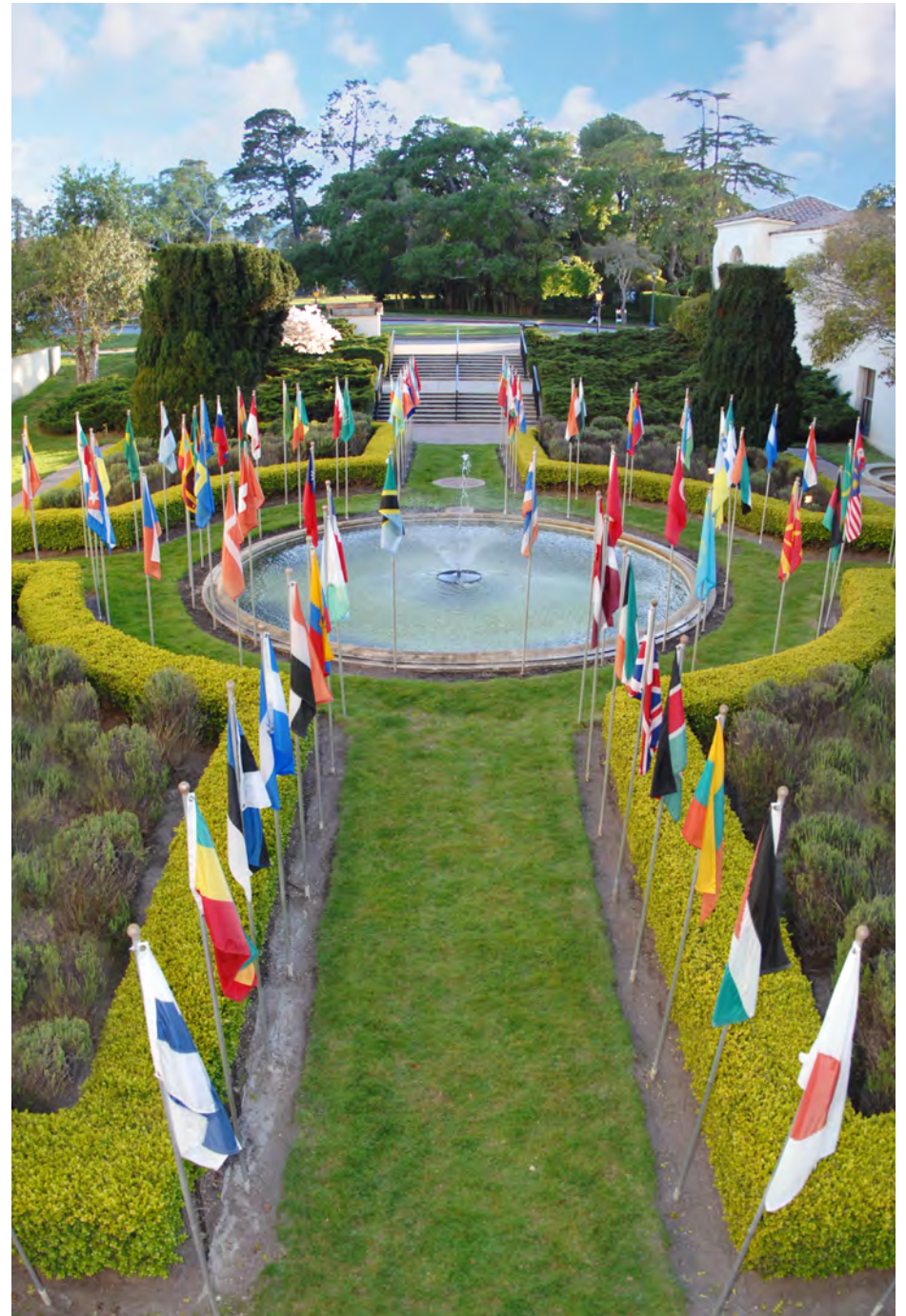


Admiral Cecil Haney retired from the United States Navy in January 2017 after completing 38 years of distinguished service, culminating in command of the U.S. Strategic Command (2013-2016) where he was responsible for strategic capabilities involving nuclear weapons, missile defense, space, and cyberspace; and the U.S. Pacific Fleet (2012-2013), where he was responsible for the manning, operations, and maintenance of the United States Navy fleet located in the Pacific and Indian oceans.

As a career submariner, he completed various operational assignments on USS John C. Calhoun, USS Frank Cable, USS Hyman G. Rickover, USS Asheville, and Submarine Squadron Eight, ultimately commanding the fast-attack nuclear submarine USS Honolulu, Submarine Squadron One, and Submarine Group Two. Adm. Haney has also served on the staff of the Chief of Naval Operations as the director of Submarine Warfare and the director of Naval Warfare Integration Group.

He now serves on various boards, including the Johns Hopkins University Applied Physics Board of Managers; the Penn State University Applied Research Lab Advisory Board; the Foundations for the U.S. Naval Academy and Naval Postgraduate School; the Aerospace Corporation Board of Trustees, and the Board of Directors for General Dynamics Corporation, Tenet Healthcare Corporation, Systems Planning and Analysis Inc., and the Center for a New American Security. He also serves as the Chairman of the Board of Directors for the Military Child Education Coalition and the Board of Trustees for Hillandale Baptist Church.

Admiral Haney earned a bachelor's degree in ocean engineering from the U.S. Naval Academy, master's degrees in engineering acoustics and system technology from the Naval Postgraduate School, and a master's degree in national security strategy from the National Defense University. He was the first African-American NPS graduate to achieve the rank of four-star Admiral (second in the Navy).
