

Government and Industry Satellite Communications Trends and Developments

During Operation Enduring Freedom (OEF) and Operation Iraqi Freedom (OIF), the Department of Defense's use of commercial satellite communications rose to 96% of the total satellite communications in theater while MILSATCOM was only providing 4% of the total.
