The Department of Defense Management at Naval Postgraduate School invites applications for an open rank, tenure-track position in budgeting and financial management. Candidates must qualify to join the faculty as active teachers and scholars. They should possess a terminal degree, such as a Ph.D., or its equivalent, in a relevant discipline, including (but not limited to) accounting, business administration, economics, political science, public administration, or public policy. We are particularly interested in scholars with strong theoretical, methodological, and applied interests in financial management. The successful applicant must be able to teach core courses in budgeting, managerial finance, and public policy, within the graduate program.

The starting date for the position is targeted for August 1, 2023.

Faculty members have access to the computing and library resources of a major research university. NPS follows a quarter system and the normal teaching workload is four courses a year. The Department of Defense Management at the Naval Postgraduate School is accredited by both NASPAA and AACSB.

Minimum qualifications:

- A Ph.D. (or its equivalent) earned before the start of the 2023-24 academic year.
- Research commensurate with the length of the professional experience.
- Must be able to complete and successfully pass a security background investigation.
- Must be a US citizen.

Applications must include a writing sample, curriculum vitae, and contact information regarding three references. Applications will be accepted until December 31, 2022.

NOTE: Veteran's preference is treated as a positive merit factor for NPS faculty positions. You are strongly encouraged to indicate if you are a veteran in your application when applying to NPS positions and you must provide a copy of your signed DD-214 (member 4 copy), Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty, or other acceptable documentation. If you are currently an active duty military member, you are required to submit a statement of service printed on command letterhead and signed by the command. The statement of service must provide the branch of service, rate/rank, all dates of service, the expected date of discharge and anticipated character of service (Honorable, General, etc.). Please note: you will be ineligible if your statement of service is not submitted with your application or it shows an expected discharge or release date greater than 120 days from the date of application.
