Troy Terronez is Senior Lecturer at the Defense Resources Management Institute (DRMI) at the U.S. Naval Postgraduate School in Monterey, California. Prior to joining the DRMI faculty in May of 2017, he served in senior Department of Defense (DoD) civilian comptroller positions in the U.S. and Europe following a career as an active duty Naval Officer.

His previous assignment was as Comptroller at Commander, Navy Region Mid-Atlantic (CNRMA), the largest region within the Commander, Navy Installations Command (CNIC) enterprise which is homeport to almost 90 U.S. Navy ships and submarines and 39 aircraft squadrons. In this capacity he led a professional financial management staff exceeding fifty personnel in the annual execution of over 1.6 billion dollars of congressionally appropriated funds and in excess of eight billion through the Department of Defense's (DoD) Future Years Defense Program (FYDP). In this capacity, he was responsible for manpower management, finance and accounting, Chief Financial Officer (CFO) Act compliance, and overall financial performance for the CNREURAFCENT Region which spans three continents, 6 countries, 8 installations, numerous Navy and National Support Elements, Cooperative Security Locations (CSLs) and Forward Operating Sites (FOSs) in support of three, 4-star Geographic Combatant Commanders.

Mr. Terronez served 22 years in the United States Navy retiring in the fall of 2010. His sea duty assignments include USS LAFAYETTE (SSBN 616) home ported in Holy Loch Scotland, USS NIMITZ (CVN 68) home ported in Bremerton, WA and USS VICKSBURG (CG 69) home ported in Mayport, FL. Shore assignments include Polaris Material Office Pacific in Bremerton, WA, U.S. Naval Postgraduate School in Monterey, CA, Logistics Manager for the SEAWOLF Submarine program and Chairman, Submarine Networks Integration Working Group at Naval Sea Systems Command in

Arlington, VA, Comptroller at Naval Support Activity Naples Italy, Comptroller at Commander, Navy Region Europe also in Naples Italy, and Executive Officer at Navy Supply Information Systems Activity in Mechanicsburg, PA.

Mr. Terronez holds a Bachelor of Science in Management Science and Computer Systems from Oklahoma State University and a Master of Science in Information Technology Management from the U.S. Naval Postgraduate School.
