Climate security policy depends in some crucial ways on assumptions about commercial factors such as the development of new technologies and the strategies of MNCs (multi-national corporations).

Sometimes these assumptions are empirically well-grounded; other times not so much.

This presentation will address some key empirical trends and recent events in the business landscape that policymakers may want to keep one eye on.

Dr. Nick Dew is a Professor of Strategic Management at the Naval Postgraduate School in Monterey, CA. His teaching and research focuses on entrepreneurship, strategy and innovation in defense and homeland security. He has a Ph.D. and MBA from the University of Virginia and experience working in the international energy industry. He is the author of over 50 research papers and an award-winning entrepreneurship textbook. His teaching and research have been funded by various DoD agencies and recognized in multiple teaching and research awards. He currently serves as the Academic Associate responsible for NPS' innovative one-year Professional MBA program and the LEAD leadership program with the U.S. Naval Academy.
