Ms. Yllemo has worked across the U.S. interagency at the strategic, operational, and tactical levels, and has designed, executed, and evaluated more than 45 domestic and international exercises and security cooperation missions. She is an Executive Member of the Global Military Advisory Council on Climate Change, and a Class of 2024 Security Fellow at the Truman National Security Project.
