






Fiery Cross Reef. January 22, 2006.











How to counter "grey zone" coercion?

- Actively support legal dispute resolution
- Push for a binding Code of Conduct, even without China
- Fully implement CUES for regional coast guards
- Continue freedom of navigation patrols (not innocent passage)
- Consider using "grey hulls" in grey zones
- Build partner capacity in Southeast Asia
