

Official Title: Director, Research Unit

Non-Tenure Track Position

- A. **Summary:** The Director of a research unit leads advanced research in areas of relevance. As appropriate, the director supervises and evaluates theses and dissertations; provides expert disciplinary advice to entities in DoN and DoD; and serves the broader academic community. The director interacts professionally in a variety of national and international fora.
- B. **Duties:** The Director
- exercises authority, direction, and control over the staff and resources assigned to the center;
 - establishes, implements and directs program goals and objectives through research lines that support graduate education;
 - proposes and leads scholarly research, disseminating those results, especially through peer-reviewed means;
 - through leadership, advances the state of knowledge in research disciplines to meet DoN needs and to provide student research topics;
 - evaluates relevance of the unit research to DoN and DoD and how well it solves timely technical challenges in defense areas;
 - may prepare and teach assigned courses and seminars in residence, off-campus, on-line, or afloat, intermittently;
 - provides academic advice, service, or consultation to Naval and Defense activities and the larger community of scholars and others, as required; and
 - performs other duties commonly understood to be faculty duties, as required.
- C. **Scope of Duties:** the Director manages and leads the research program and associated researchers, and has significant off-campus impacts through services offered to DoN activities, DoD activities, and professional organizations. Reporting directly to the Dean, the Director advises the Dean on the status and direction of the research unit. The Director may engage with students who are located at duty stations across the world as well as at Monterey.
- D. **Qualifications:**
- An earned doctoral degree in a discipline that supports interdisciplinary instructional and thesis research needs;
 - extensive experience (typically greater than ten years) as a faculty member in accredited institutions of higher education (or equivalent professional experience); and
 - a national reputation for scholarship supported by a significant publications record and research funding history.
- E. **Special Requirements:** Position designated non-critical sensitive (requiring Secret eligibility) unless otherwise designated via the Position Designation Tool on the AD PD Addendum; incumbent required to file OGE 450, Confidential Financial Disclosure Report.
