## SCARY STATISTICS

- The 1st Jack O'Lanterns were actually made from turnips.
- The Heaviest Pumpkin ever recorded was grown by Beni Meier of Switzerland in 2014 and weighed 2,323 lbs.¹
- An est. 157 million Americans will celebrate Halloween in 2015 and spending is expected to reach \$6.9 billion. <sup>2</sup>
- About 1 in 10 Halloween celebrants plan to dress their furry friends in costumes this year.

Children are more than twice as likely to be killed in a pedestrian/car accident on Halloween than on any other night. The average is 5.5 pedestrian deaths each Halloween. <sup>3</sup>

Just 30% of of these accidents occur at intersections and crosswalks. <sup>3</sup>

12% of children 5 yrs or younger are allowed to trick-or-treat alone! 4

## Tips For staying safe w

- Use established crosswalks whenever possible.
- Don't let your young children trick or treat without a trusted adult!
- Wear well-fitting masks, costumes, and shoes to avoid blocked vision, trips, and falls.
- Carry flashlights while trick-or-treating.
- Wear Hi-vis clothing when possible. If your child's costume is dark, then have them wear glow sticks or apply hi-vis tape to them (it can be found at hardware stores).
- If you are attending a party where you plan to drink, make arrangements and plan accordingly in advance. Drunk or buzzed driving is
   <u>NEVER</u> acceptable and Halloween is an especially dangerous time for children and pedestrians.
