





UNITED NATIONS PEACEKEEPING OPERATIONS INSTRUCTOR COURSE

The aim of the course is to enhance peacekeeping trainers' knowledge base and instructor skills in the essential topics of United Nations (UN) peacekeeping (PKO). Upon completion of the course, participants will be well versed in UN issues, and will have the ability to directly train other peacekeeping instructors, or unit personnel, on UN policies and procedures.

OBJECTIVES

At the end of the course, participants will be able to:

- Understand the key "Core Pre-deployment Training Modules" issued by the UN Integrated Training Service/ Departments
- Demonstrate knowledge of instructor/peacekeeping trainer skills in UN peacekeeping essential topics
- Understand the characteristics and complexities of integrated UN missions
- ♦ Articulate UN issues in general
- Train other peacekeeping instructors on UN policies and procedures

TOPICS

The training methodology includes presentations from subject matter experts (SMEs) in conjunction with group and plenary discussions and classroom exercises. Group discussions and exercises will focus on problem-solving various aspects of PKO. Course topics may include:

- UN guidelines: PKO training
- US Government directives, contingency operations (CONOPS), rules of engagement (ROE), and operational estimates
- UN logistics
- Use of force and adapting ROE
- Transitions and measures of effectiveness (MoE)
- Developing exercises


PARTICIPANTS

This course is ideally suited for junior- to mid-level officers or civilian equivalents.

FUNDING

Educational programs are primarily implemented through Title 22 authorized programs (International Military Education and Training, Foreign Military Sales, Peacekeeping Operations) and various Title 10 authorized programs such as the Maritime Security Initiative (MSI) and Regional Defense Combating Terrorism and Irregular Warfare Fellowship Program (RDFP).
