Mr. Steene's portfolio includes Emerging Technologies and S&T, including Autonomous Weapon Systems policy, and Directed Energy Weapons policy.

Prior to joining OSD Strategy & Force Development, Mr. Steene worked in OSD Space Policy with a portfolio that included Space Support (launch, satellite control, orbital debris mitigation, and rendezvous and proximity operations), as well as strategic stability and all space-related issuances (Directives, Instructions, DTMs, etc.).

From August of 2009 to June of 2010, Mr. Steene was a student at the National War College.

From January 2007 to August of 2009, Mr. Steene was the Resources and Force Structure desk officer in OSD Stability Operations Capabilities where he focused on integrating general-purpose forces into irregular warfare doctrine, planning, and force structure.

From February 2003 to January of 2007, Mr. Steene was a member of the OSD Policy Iraq team focused on political-military issues.

From October 2000 to October 2003, Mr. Steene served as a Presidential Management Intern in the Office of the Secretary of Defense with developmental rotations in OSD Policy (Requirements & Plans and Middle East Policy), HQMC (Expeditionary Policy and National Plans), OSD PA&E (Projection Forces), and OSD AT&L (Resource Analysis).

From April 1998 to December 2002, Mr. Steene served in the U.S. Naval Reserve as an Intelligence Specialist. He was mobilized in support of the National Imagery and Mapping Agency under Operation Enduring Freedom from October 2001 to July of 2002.

From February 1992 to February 1998, Mr. Steene served as a U.S. Navy nuclear-trained electrician. He served aboard USS MIAMI (SSN 755) from November 1993 to January 1998, deploying to the Arabian Gulf in support of Operation Desert Watch and to the North Atlantic three times in support of classified operations.

Mr. Steene holds a B.A. in History from Carleton College (1991), an M.A. in National Security Studies from Georgetown University (2000), and a Master of Science in National Security Studies from the National War College (2010).
